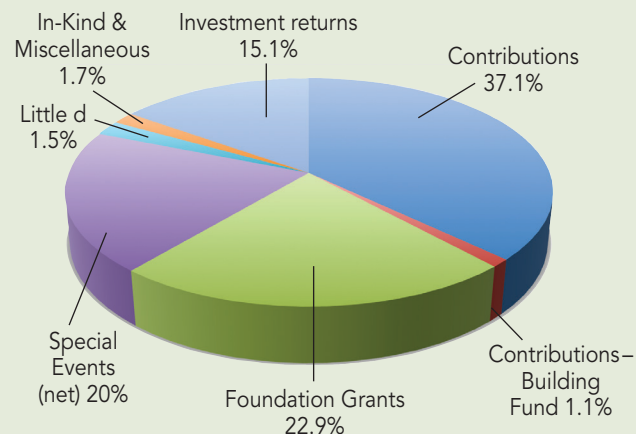

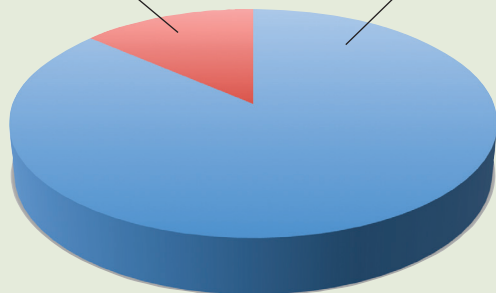

Each year when I begin to write this annual report letter, I take some time to look back on the year and try to find a “theme” that defined those twelve months. It’s kind of a nice exercise for me, and in the past it’s been about dreams becoming realities and about the people involved who become part of our 15-LOVE family. Generally uplifting themes. Looking back on 2013, the one thing that keeps ringing true in my head is “Rain!” My brain keeps telling me that, clearly, rain cannot be our theme for the year. But, this thought won’t go away and the other things I’ve tried to write just aren’t coming together, so I’m going to give rain a try...



Some of you may remember that our annual fundraiser, Fore Love & Money, a golf and tennis event held at Schuyler Meadows Club, was rained out 3 times last year, forcing us to resign to the fact that it was just not meant to be. The first two scheduled days were in June and early July, and during that time in 2013, it seemed to rain every day. In fact, the month of June alone that year saw nearly 5 inches more than the average rainfall for June. Our third scheduled date for Fore Love & Money was in August, and it seemed that particular day was the only day it rained in August. It was just plain bad luck and for the first time in 22 years, we had to cancel the event. What happened, however, is that we had the opportunity to call those who planned to support us that day three times. We had conversations that we would not have had time for on the day of the event. We heard stories of why people wanted to support 15-LOVE and what they enjoyed about our event. We heard personal stories of their event disasters. We were able to connect, and reflecting back, we enjoyed that (in the moment, having to send that many emails and make that many calls was massively stressful, but we started to get good at it). No one wants to write on their resume that they are good at canceling events, but it’s a unique skill we gained in 2013.

The rain also affected our summer classes. We did not have one full day of classes for the first two weeks of our summer program! Unfortunately, that makes it difficult to get kids into a routine, and can become frustrating, but I’m happy to say that our families stuck it out and we served over 1,900 participants in the summer of 2013 – beating our old record by 14 kids! Our instructors went out to the courts with their umbrellas in hand to greet the families for the first few days, and that extra effort seemed to work. At the newly built Michigan Avenue Park tennis courts, our attendance rose 100% and families raved about the amazing facility – even through the rain.

Finally, the rain affected our home. If you have been to our office, you may have noticed that you have to walk down a few steps to get into the back door from the parking lot. You might also have noticed that our office is at the bottom of a hill on North Main and that our parking lot was designed to pitch the water towards the back corner of our building. When we got a heavy rain, water would come flooding in the back door. This had happened before, but happened four times in 2013, resulting in damage including a ruined back rug, some warped boxes, and a few pairs of instructor sneakers that never smelled the same. When the floods came in during what would have been program hours, the instructors were there and they would help us grab everything we could find and run outside to try to push the water away. We would come in dripping wet, but it ended up being a bonding experience. A crisis we

all worked hard to try to avert and we tried everything – brooms, plastic bin covers, our own selves – to try to keep the water away. It made for shared stories the rest of the summer, and built an understanding of drainage issues. Eventually, we had to build a wall that sticks out into our parking lot to permanently avert the water (thanks to Nigro Companies!). We now have to find other team building activities, but for the 2013 group of instructors, this was certainly part of what defined their summer

There was certainly one upside to the rain, and that was our garden! The garden flourished in 2013. We ended up with so many green beans and tomatoes, we were literally handing them out on the streets. Our kids enjoyed okra and kale, cucumbers and squash, herbs and lettuce. They learned to cook with them, eat them raw and care for the plants. They ate them with us and took them home to their own kitchens. Kids who hated tomatoes learned how amazing different varieties of cherry tomatoes are (their favorite was the yellow sunburst). They didn't learn much about watering because that seemed to take care of itself, but that will come.

So, while rain seemed to define 2013, maybe what defined it even more was overcoming. We have found ways to laugh about it. Our families still found ways to stay connected. Our supporters remained faithful. And we are exceptionally grateful. The spirit that came out of the rain was strong, supportive and uplifting.

Finally, I have one more story to share. There is a wall with a few awards we have received over the years hanging under a clock in the open space of our office. The awards are crooked, sloping up as they go from left to right. Under normal circumstances, that would bother me and I would have fixed it by now, but I probably never will because it is a reminder of when we moved in. A few of us, including Herb Shultz, Eileen McCarthy and my husband, were in the office hanging pictures and getting things finished up on a Saturday afternoon to be ready for our open house celebrating the new building in 2009. My husband, Gerard, was hanging the awards and I was getting tired and not feeling well, so I rushed him and didn't notice at the time they were crooked. Early the next morning, our second son was born, which helped explain my rush to leave, but the crooked awards always serve as a visual reminder of how long this has been our home. This year, on the day and time of that very son's birthday party, Grappa '72 Restaurant held a fundraiser in memory of Ron Kohn, a beloved board member who passed away in 2012. One thing everyone knew about Ron was how important his family was to him. Unfortunately, I had to miss that party to celebrate Ron, but I think he probably understood because I'm sure he would have made the same decision – family comes first. We are using the funds raised to begin a scholarship in Ron's memory and more will come on that, but for now, we have crooked awards to remind us of the importance of family. Families are rarely perfect, sometimes we get tired and cranky and might even miss some important events, but in the end we are still able to overcome the rain – together.

Thank you for your unwavering support. Thank you for helping to keep our family strong. Thank you for the umbrellas to shield us from the rain. Thank you for making it possible for us to serve over 3,800 participants throughout the year through Book Power Clubs, College Prep and Leadership Programs, Healthy Cooking Classes and an interactive Gardening Program, Book Giveaways, our Little d Award, and our Tennis and Life Skills programming. Thank you.

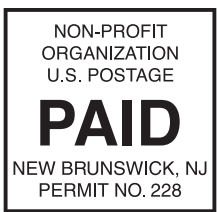
